How do we care for students?

Upon admission in Year 7, students are placed in house based, mixed ability tutor groups overseen by a Pastoral Leader, Achievement Leader and Assistant Head Teacher supporting the academic and personal development of every student.

Tutors will see their tutor group every morning and are a daily point of contact to reward achievement and alleviate any concerns students may have. Pastoral Leaders will enhance the work of tutors and support students throughout the school day. Pastoral Leaders and Assistant Headteachers will monitor academic progress and facilitate appropriate interventions so that no student falls behind.

We value close links with our parents and carers and we keep them fully informed about each student's progress in every lesson. This is done through our established stamp system which lets students, parents and staff know how well students have done in every lesson. Stamps are shown in the student planner so parents can track very closely the progress students make in every lesson.

Parents will also have a picture of students' achievement and attitude to learning in termly progress reports and our staff welcome parental contact at any point throughout the year. There is also a parents' evening for every year group which provides



parents with an opportunity to meet all of their child's teachers. Year 7 students have an additional settling in evening soon after they start at Bilton School to ensure that there has been a smooth transition from primary to secondary school.

Finally all staff, this includes office staff, support staff and teachers will aim to get to know students during their time at Bilton School. All of us will model appropriate behaviours of courtesy and respect so that students see us as role models who are firm, friendly and caring. We will work together to provide every student with the very best education possible and encourage them to be the best they can be at all times.



What do students study?

At Bilton School we provide an exciting and academically challenging curriculum with a focus on strong teaching and learning. The curriculum is broad and balanced, catering for the needs and abilities of all of our learners.

Key Stage 3 Year 7 & 8

A challenging and rigorous Key Stage Three curriculum forms the basis for a successful set of results at the end of Year 11. For that reason, at Bilton we place a significant emphasis on the curriculum's core subjects in this Key Stage. We also understand the importance of students having a balanced and broad curriculum offer. Students also receive technology, languages, creative based subjects and core PE lessons.

At the end of year 8, students can choose their option subjects to be studied at Level 2. This is an important point in their education and students receive copious amounts of guidance and information regarding the right choices for them to realise their personal ambitions. This process also includes guidance for parents and carers and several events are organised to support parents and students in making these choices.

Key Stage 4 Year 9, 10 & 11

At Key Stage Four, our curriculum is appropriate and challenging. It aims to meet the needs and learning styles of our students and ensures that they leave Bilton with a set of results which will allow them to progress to their next stage of their learning. Students continue to have four lessons of English, Science and Mathematics per week. As well as this, students have the opportunity to study a range of EBACC subjects including the Sciences, History, Geography, Languages and Computer Science. Beyond this they

can also opt for subjects within Technology, the Arts, Sport and Hair & Beauty. The curriculum is underpinned by our Character and Culture programme designed to prepare our students to be tolerant and resilient 21st century citizens. Our curriculum offer at Key Stage Four is designed with the students in mind. It is created to provide them with a vast amount of opportunities whether they be 6th Form, College or Apprenticeships.

Key Stage 5 Year 12 & 13

Students in the Sixth Form are able to choose from a variety of academic or vocational courses to make up their Post 16 curriculum. Bilton School offers a wide variety of linear A Levels, with over 15 different courses to choose from, including Mathematics, the core Sciences, Languages and English Literature. Our vocational offer is also something we're incredibly proud of, offering six different

BTEC subjects including Business, Sport and Health and Social Care. Students are expected to study their courses full time for two years before moving on to the next stage of their education. For many of our students, this means university.

Stretch and challenge

At Bilton School we believe all pupils should be challenged, inspired and empowered by learning to allow them to be the best that they can be. Stretching and challenging all students of any ability is vital to ensuring they reach their full potential and leave Bilton School proud of their individual successes.

Our aim is to ensure all pupils, including our most able, have opportunities to stretch and extend their knowledge and experience above and beyond what they ever thought possible. Our aims for every student are:

- Achieving highly successful outcomes.
- Access to a curriculum that stretches and challenges.
- Grouping that allows similar ability peers to academically stretch and challenge each other.
- Offered opportunities beyond the curriculum that develops their gifts and talents.
- Feel valued as an individual and encouraged to achieve their full potential.
- Offered opportunities to develop independence and leadership skills in preparation for post-16 and beyond.

We place a real emphasis that stretch and challenge starts in the classroom, and that every child at Bilton School should be offered the opportunity to achieve their full potential in any subject. We strive for every lesson to:

- Embed rigour and depth in the subject matter.
- Develop problem solving skills.
- Promote creativity in the subject and beyond.
- Celebrate intellectual curiosity.
- Develop a culture of independence and ownership.
- Promote academic excellence.

Bilton Sixth Form has a growing reputation within the local community as an establishment that offers a quality education where students achieve highly. In recent years, we have seen our student numbers grow by almost 200% and the applications for the academic year 2017/18 also continues this pattern.

Why is our Sixth Form popular?

As part of the Sixth Form, our students become a part of a supportive environment that challenges them to be the best they can be. A great deal of time is spent preparing students for university life and beyond; this involves trips to universities, apprenticeship workshops, the teaching of time management strategies and much, much more.

As a result of this dedication, we have witnessed an increasing number of our students going on to university. For the past two years, any student who wanted to go to

university was accepted on to a course of their choosing; around 90% of these were their first choice destinations.

We aim to build well-rounded young adults, not only through our rigorous academic programmes of study, but also through other areas of our curriculum. Students complete work experience placements, lead school assemblies, run charity events and support younger students with any difficulties they could be having both inside and outside the classroom.

We're incredibly proud of our Sixth Form students; they serve as an example to the rest of the school about what can be achieved through dedication and perseverance. Bilton Sixth Form helps fully prepare their young people for the next stage of their life, whatever that may be.

Extra curricular opportunities

Life at Bilton School is enriched by a vast array of extra-curricular activities such as clubs in English, Science, Drama and many Music and Sports clubs. Our clubs are open to students of all abilities. A major school production occurs every year as well as Bilton's Got Talent which is proving popular with students and parents alike.

We have a long tradition at Bilton School of cultivating and inspiring countless athletes and Rugby is a sport we excel in. Our Rugby teams have an excellent reputation in the local area with many students going on to represent district and county teams. More recently, we have had several students recruited in to the Wasps academy for their excellence in Rugby and we expect this to continue long in to the future.

As well as Rugby, we also have a reputation of producing talented athletes in other sports. In Football, we have several students on the books of professional teams, representing their academies across the West Midlands, including Aston Villa, where we have both male and female representatives. In Athletics, we also have a reputation of developing excellence. Currently in school we have students who represent Great Britain at various age groups, some taking opportunities to train and compete abroad on a regular basis. Bilton School is also proud to currently have a nationally ranked tennis player and a World Kick Boxing Champion as students.

School residential trips are some of the memorable experiences available to students at Bilton School.

These experiences are heartily encouraged and carefully mapped out across all school years. These include Sixth Form trips to New York, Key Stage Four Ski Trips, Key Stage Three trips to the Ardeche in the South of France and History trips to Auschwitz and beyond. There are regular trips to theatres, art galleries and sites of historic or geographical interest.
